The Boeing Company Drinking Water System (CA1910137) is a small industrial facility that currently serves approximately 60 employees and contractor personnel. In the event of a drinking water emergency, multiple methods will be used to notify consumers to include the following:

- 1) Notify all on-site Managers by telephone or in person to inform employees of the emergency.
- 2) Notify the Emergency Services Dispatcher to distribute the warning via radio to all on-site guards.
- 3) Send e-mail notification to all employees via Master Distribution List.
- 4) Post Warning signs at restrooms, kitchen areas and other points of potential consumption.
- 5) Post Warning notice on electronic bulletin boards.
