Section 1 and 2 District Engineers, you received this email last Thursday and can disregard this email.

Due COB May 7, 2021

DDW management has requested that our sections compile a list of public water systems that are "Highly likely to have a critical impact to their ability to meet demands" in the next few months. Public water systems to be included are those that meet either of these criteria:

- The PWS contacted your office in 2021 regarding critical drought concerns
- The PWS experienced substantial drought issues during the 2014 drought and did not develop a permanent fix.
- Based on your experience, you have high confidence that the PWS will experience severe supply issues leading to alternate sources – including hauled water- being pursued.

If **any** PWS meets any of those criteria then they should be included on the list. Please also reach out to LPAs to get their information. Prioritize Community PWS and schools/daycare facilities but do not exclude any systems.

Why are we asking for this now? It is a certainty we will be asked soon to compile this list for Board updates and interagency communications. This list will also inform management regarding the need to identify resources that could help water systems. We are aware the list could get misinterpreted and will make every effort to explain what the list represents as we share it.

What do you need to do?

- Fill in the information in the attached template
- Forward this email with the attachment to your LPAs
- When complete, name your District and LPA files based on the District/LPA (e.g. "D03", "LPANapa") and save them in the following folder: <S:\DDW\DDW-Public\NCFOB\2021drought>

If an LPA indicates they don't have any systems for the list at this time please let me know.

Also, we will provide instruction regarding how to update the list once we have the information compiled into one spreadsheet. We will use this tracking mechanism until we have additional resources. (LPAs should continue to inform the DE as new systems are identified.)
