

The program provides an easy and convenient way to get rid of large, unwanted household items, including mattresses, water heaters, sofas and chairs.

To schedule a Bulky Item Pickup, call Lakewood's disposal contractor, EDCO, at 562-531-3054, before 3:30 p.m. at least one day prior to your regular trash collection day. The service is free but limited to six pick-ups a year per single family residence, with up to six items per pick-up.

E-waste, such as TVs and computer equipment, should not be placed in your regular trash. E-waste can be disposed of through a Bulky Item Pickup or at EDCO's transfer station in Signal Hill.

At Tuesday night's meeting, Lakewood City Council Members approved three public works projects that continue to raise the bar on community infrastructure, reaffirming its long-standing commitment to maintaining top-quality services and enhancing quality of life.



Enduring Commitment to Smooth Streets

Lakewood has a longstanding reputation for its well-maintained streets, and the council will continue that legacy with over \$12 million allocated to repaving work. Covering approximately 13 linear miles of primarily residential roads and alleys, the project will be funded through a combination of Proposition C, Measure R and Measure M exchanged funds. This move is part of Lakewood's unique commitment to continuously repave 100% of its streets—a promise already achieved once and now being upheld through ongoing investment.

Safer Roads Through Traffic Calming

In a proactive effort to increase traffic and pedestrian safety, the council is also launching a pilot traffic calming program, starting with Palo Verde Avenue. The first of three planned streets (with Clark Avenue and Studebaker Road to follow), the pilot may include speed feedback signs, improved signage and striped bulb-outs to reduce vehicle speeds and increase safety. Final details of the measures will be brought forward in a future council session.



The session runs about 90 minutes and concludes with a free raffle for all in attendance.





"Despite the challenges, Lakewood is known throughout Southern California as a city that does everything it can to deter and reduce the use of illegal fireworks," says McCormack.

With higher temperatures ahead, water use will certainly increase. To help conserve this precious resource, the City

of Lakewood recommends residents continue to follow these best practices:

- No landscape watering within 48 hours of rainfall.
- No hosing off sidewalks, driveways and other hardscapes.
- No sprinkler runoff to sidewalks, gutters and other landscape.
- No washing of cars and equipment, except from a bucket or hose with an automatic shut-off nozzle.

Additionally, in commercial and industrial settings, the statewide restriction remains against the watering of "non-functional" turf (solely ornamental and not used for recreation or gatherings). This rule does not apply to residential water users.

"We appreciate our Lakewood residents for their continued efforts to use water efficiently," said Lakewood Water Resources Director Dr. Derek Nguyen. "They help our community protect and preserve the water we have today for many years to come."
