The Consumer Confidence Report, or CCR, is an annual water quality report that the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) requires Orange to provide you. The purpose of the CCR is to raise customer's awareness of the quality of their drinking water, where their drinking water comes from, what it takes to deliver water to their homes, and the importance of protecting drinking water sources.

In the past, Orange has mailed consumers a printed copy of the CCR to comply with the SDWA. On February 21, 2013, the State Water Resources Control Board expanded their interpretation of the SDWA to allow for electronic delivery of the CCR. This method will allow Orange to reduce the usage of paper and minimize potential printing and mailing costs.
