PUBLIC WATER SYSTEM INACTIVATION SAN JUAN OAKS GOLF CLUB - WATER SYSTEM NO. 3500903

The State Water Resources Control Board, Division of Drinking Water (Division) has reviewed the status of the San Juan Oaks Golf Club (hereinafter SJO Golf Club) water system and determined that it no longer falls within the regulatory jurisdiction of the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) under the California Safe Drinking Water Act.

The Division made this determination because the SJO Golf Club water system does not serve the requisite number of customers or service connections to constitute a public water system (See Health & Saf. Code, § 116275, subd. (h)) based on an email dated January 12, 2022 notifying the Division of the closure, and the attached Water System Classification Worksheet dated January 18, 2022 stating the SJO Golf Club has been closed to the public since January 3, 2022 for renovations. If the system resumes serving the requisite number of customers or connections to constitute a public water system, you may be required to submit a new application for a domestic water supply permit. Contact the Monterey District at dwpdist05@waterboards.ca.gov before resuming service as a public water system. Failure to obtain a new domestic water supply permit before resuming operations as a public water system may subject you to monetary penalties and civil and criminal liability under the California Safe Drinking Water Act.

It is illegal to make a false statement or representation to the State Water Board, Division of Drinking Water to comply with the California Safe Drinking Water Act. Doing so could subject you and the water system to significant civil or criminal penalties. (See Health & Saf. Code, §§ 116725 and 116730.) If you believe that a prior statement or

representation about your water system's operations was made in error, please contact me to determine whether your water system should continue to be regulated as a public water system.



7. In addition, note any changes to date during the 2022 calendar year: The San Juan Oaks Golf Course and Club House was sold in August of 2021. Two (2) new wells are in the process of being drilled. On January 3, 2022, the Golf Course and the Club House were closed for renovations.

Please attach any available statistics on daily attendance to the area served by your water system during the 2021 calendar year. The Golf Course has been closed on Mondays and Tuesdays, after it had closed down due to COVID in March 2020. The Club House which includes the restaurant and all dining has been closed since March of 2020. As of the reopening of the Golf Course, on average 100 golfers visited the course per day during the week and approximately 200 people on the weekend. These were not the same golfers on a daily basis. As of January 3, 2022, the Golf Course has closed down for renovations. At this time, the anticipated reopen time frame for the business is April 1, 2023.
