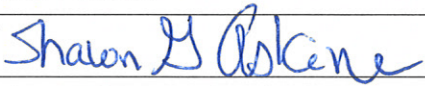

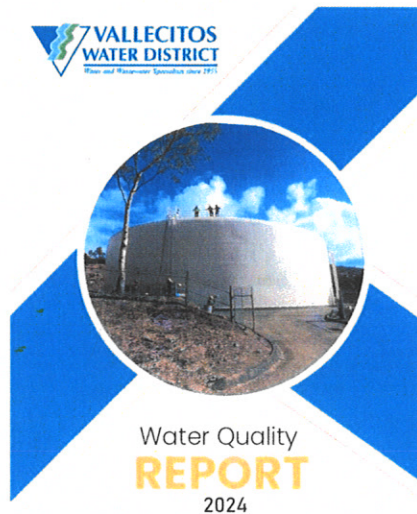

Earthquake Strikes Near Julian

April 14, 2025, was a shaky morning in San Marcos, but we were prepared! Our largest reservoirs at the Ed Pedrazzi Water Storage Facility (formerly Twin Oaks Reservoirs), which hold 73 million gallons of drinking water, are not only structurally sound but are also designed with seismic valves to stop water loss in case of a 5.5 or higher magnitude earthquake.

The valves (pictured at right) on these tanks have sophisticated seismic sensors that determine earth ground movement representative of an earthquake and not related to other types of movement, such as a large vehicle driving by.

In case there is a 5.5 or higher event, these valves will automatically close to protect the water supply. This will provide Vallecitos time to respond

in case of downstream breaks in our water distribution system without losing precious water storage, especially if we get severed from water connections from our water providers. This is just one of the many ways we're prepared for emergencies.
