On June 8, the State of California issued a notice to the Borregod Water District on two issues, the first is: Prepare for Drought Impacts Statewide. With California experiencing its second consecutive dry year, and due to the effects of climate change, we are all reminded that drought planning and conservation are now a California way of life. The first six months of water year 2021 rank as the fourth driest on record.

In various portions of the State, these conditions may contribute to reduced yield from ground and/or surface water supply sources, challenges with water quality, and difficulties in meeting normal system demands.

The Borrego Springs Basin (BSB) is critically overdrafted and routinely experience the "drought impacts" that are being realized in other parts of California. Changes in groundwater elevations historically occur in BSB without widespread adverse impacts to water quality/availability and BWD continuously monitors the situation for any trends.

Although local rainfall is important, the impacts of both wet and dry years are not immediately realized in our "slow moving" aquifer as they are in other areas of the State. The rainfall impacts are realized cumulatively over time.

The State has concluded sustained preparation and planning are critical in this situation and taking actions early was key during the last drought in California. The State suggests the following components should be included in BWD system evaluation: a Monitor the depth-to-ground-water level in wells under both pumping and non-pumping conditions: b. Read and record well pumping capacity: c. Monitor and record the water levels in your system storage tanks during various high-demand periods of the day: d. Repair any obvious leaks in your storage tanks and distribution system. BWD checks all the boxes in this area and has maintained an extensive well monitoring (quality and quantity), real time remote reservoir levels and meter reading programs for decades. These activities are part of normal system operations and BWD responds to any leaks 2477.

In addition, the State encourages creation of an awareness that voluntary conservation, when in Borrego Springs or in any part of California, is critical as conservation extends existing supplies. The State Water Board urges BWD to work with all customers in our service area to voluntarily reduce by reducing watering outdoor, applying potable water directly to driveways and sidewalks, irrigate turf and ornamental landscapes during and within 48 hours after measurable rainfall and others.

The other State Notice received by BWD pertains to Extension of Water Shutoff Moratorium. As the state prepares to fully reopen in the coming weeks, certain provisions of Governor Newsom's COVID-19 related executive orders remain. On June 11, 2021, the governor issued Executive Order N-08-21, which extends the prohibition on discontinuing water service for residential customers and small businesses in a critical infrastructure sector until September 30, 2021. Water systems played—and still play—a vital role in protecting health and safety by halting water shutoffs for residential customers. On June 8th, the State of California issued a Notice to the Borrego Water District and its Customers to be prepared for Drought Impacts Statewide. With California experiencing its second consecutive dry year, and due to the effects of climate change, we are all reminded that drought planning and conservation are now a California way of life. Although local rainfall is important in Borrego, the impacts of both wet and dry years are not immediately realized in the relatively "slow moving" Borrego Springs Basin (BSB) as they are in other areas of the State. The rainfall impacts are realized cumulatively over time in BSB.

In various portions of the State, the dry conditions may contribute to reduced yield from ground and/or surface water supplies, challenges with water quality, and difficulties in meeting normal system demands. The BSB is critically over drafted and routinely experience the "drought impacts" that are being realized in other parts of CA. Changes in groundwater elevations historically occur in BSB without widespread adverse impacts to water quality/availability. BWD continuously monitors groundwater elevations and quality for any trends.

The State has concluded sustained preparation and planning are critical in this situation and taking actions early was key during the last drought in California. The State suggests the following steps be taken by all Water Agencies: a. Monitor the depth-to-ground-water level in wells under both pumping and non-pumping conditions: b. Read and record well pumping capacity: c. Monitor and record the water levels in your system storage tanks during various high-demand periods of the day: d. Repair any obvious leaks in your storage tanks and distribution system. BWD checks all the boxes in this area and has maintained an extensive well monitoring program (quality and quantity), real time remote reservoir levels, meter reading programs and repair of leaks 24/7. These activities suggested by The State are all part of normal BWD system operations.

In addition, the State encourages creation of an awareness that voluntary conservation, when in Borrego Springs or in any part of CA, is critical as conservation extends existing supplies. The State Water Board urges BWD to work with all customers in our service area to voluntarily reduce watering outdoors when possible, eliminate applying potable water directly to driveways/sidewalks, and discontinue irrigation of turf and ornamental landscapes during and within 48 hours after measurable rainfall.

State Extends of Water Shut Off Ban

The State also sent a Notice to BWD on the Extension of Water Shutoff Moratorium. As the state prepares to fully reopen in the coming weeks, certain provisions of Governor Newsom's COVID-19 related executive orders remain. On June 11, 2021, the governor issued Executive Order N-08-21, which extends the prohibition on discontinuing water service for residential customers and small businesses in a critical infrastructure sector until September 30, 2021. Any Customer experiencing financial difficulty in paying water/sewer bills, please contact BWD and ask for Esmeralda.

ESTADO DECLARA AVISO DE SEQUÍA

El 8 de Junio, el Estado de California emitió un aviso al Distrito de Agua de Borrego y sus Clientes para que se preparen para los impactos de la sequía en todo el estado. Con California experimentando su segundo año seco consecutivo, y debido a los efectos del cambio climático, todos recordamos que la planificación y conservación de la sequía son ahora una forma de vida de California. Aunque las precipitaciones locales son importantes en Borrego, los impactos de los años secos y húmedos no se materializan de inmediato en la Cuenca de Borrego Springs (BSB) por su relativamente "lento movimiento" como ocurre en otras áreas del estado. Los impactos de la lluvia se realizan de forma acumulativa a lo largo del tiempo en BSB.

CALENDARIO DEL DISTRITO JUNTAS VIRTUALES – JULIO 2021

En varias partes del estado, las condiciones secas pueden contribuir al rendimiento reducido de los suministros de agua subterránea y/o superficial, desafíos con la calidad del agua y dificultades para satisfacer las demandas normales del sistema. El BSB (la Cuenca) está críticamente sobrjirada en exceso y experimenta habitualmente los "impactos de la sequía" que se están produciendo en otras partes de CA. Históricamente, los cambios en las elevaciones del agua subterránea ocurren en BSB sin impactos adversos generalizados en la calidad / disponibilidad del agua. BWD monitorea continuamente las elevaciones y la calidad del agua subterránea para detectar cualquier tendencia.

El estado ha llegado a la conclusión de que la preparación y la planificación sostenidas son fundamentales en esta situación y tomar medidas tempranas fueron clave durante la última sequía en California. El Estado sugiere que todas las Agencias de Agua tomen las siguientes medidas: a. Monitorear los niveles del agua de la profundidad hasta el suelo de los pozos tanto en condiciones de bombeo como sin bombeo: b. Leer y registrar la capacidad de bombeo del pozo: c. Monitorear y registrar los niveles de agua en los tanques de almacenamiento de su sistema durante los períodos de alta demanda del día: d. Reparar cualquier fuga obvia en los tanques de almacenamiento y sistema de distribución. BWD verifica todas las casillas en esta área y ha mantenido un extenso programa de monitoreo de pozos (calidad y cantidad), niveles de reservas remotos en tiempo real, programas de lectura de medidores y reparación de fugas 24/7. Estas actividades sugeridas por el Estado son todas parte de las operaciones normales del sistema BWD.

Además, el estado fomenta la creación de conciencia de que la conservación voluntaria, en Borrego Springs o en cualquier parte de CA, es fundamental ya que la conservación amplía los suministros existentes. La Junta Estatal de Agua insta a BWD a trabajar con todos los clientes en nuestra área de servicio para reducir voluntariamente el riego al aire libre cuando sea posible, eliminar la aplicación de agua potable directamente en los caminos de entrada / aceras y suspender el riego de césped y paisajes ornamentales durante y dentro de las 48 horas posteriores a una lluvia mensurable.

EL ESTADO EXTIENDE LA PROHIBICIÓN DE CORTE DE AGUA

El Estado también envió un Aviso a BWD sobre la extensión de la moratoria del los cierres de agua. Mientras el estado se prepara para reabrir por completo en las próximas semanas, quedan ciertas disposiciones de las órdenes ejecutivas relacionadas con el COVID-19 del gobernador Newsom. El 11 de Junio del 2021, El Gobernador emitió la Orden Ejecutiva N-08-21, que extiende la prohibición de descontinuar el servicio de agua para clientes residenciales y pequeñas empresas en un sector de infraestructura crítica hasta el 30 de septiembre de 2021. Cualquier Cliente que este pasando por dificultades financieras para pagar las facturas de agua / alcantarillado, comuníquese con BWD y pregunte por Esmeralda.
