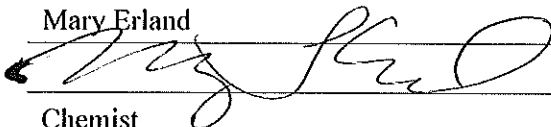

City Of Lompoc Passes Federal And State Water Quality Standards *2018 Water Quality Report now available in English and Spanish*

LOMPOC, CA, July 12, 2019 – Water testing results from 2018 have been released for the City of Lompoc, and the city has again met all drinking water health standards set by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the State of California.

The 2018 Water Quality Report is now available in English and Spanish brochures at Lompoc City Hall, the Lompoc Aquatic Center, the Lompoc Public Library, the Dick DeWees Community and Senior Center, the Lompoc Water Treatment Plant and also in electronic form on the City of Lompoc website at: [Water Quality Report - English](#) and [Water Quality Report - Spanish](#).

Included in the Water Quality Report is information on water sources, treatment processes, management and planning, lead and copper, and how community members can learn more about the Lompoc Water Division.

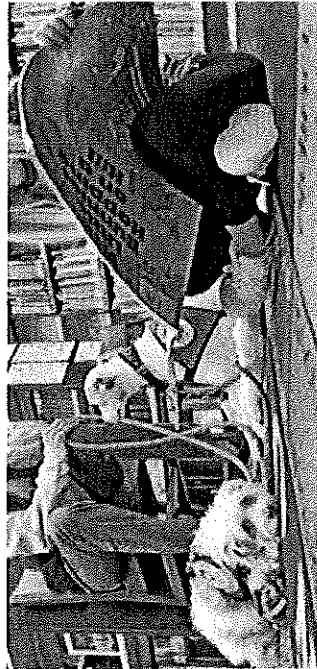
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City of Lompoc

The City of Lompoc was founded as a town in 1874 and incorporated as a city on Aug. 13, 1888. Prior to the City's establishment, the building of La Purisima Mission in 1787 marked the earliest European settlement in the Lompoc Valley. Growth in the Lompoc Valley was sparked by the 1901 completion of the coastal railroad between San Francisco and Los Angeles, which included the extension of a spur into Lompoc. The Lompoc Valley is home to Vandenberg Air Force Base, the first missile base of the United States Air Force. Today, the City of Lompoc is a travel destination known for its downtown mural program, local wines and acclaimed cuisine, historic landmarks, parks and nearby beaches. Lompoc's first newspaper, the Lompoc Review, was founded in 1891 by Sarah Beryl Lee. In 1911, the Lompoc Review was purchased by the Lee family and has since been owned and operated by them. The Lompoc Review is a weekly newspaper that serves the Lompoc community and is one of the oldest newspapers in the Central Coast area.



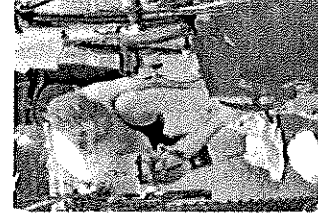

for everybody" Beryl said. Among the library's free services are access to its collection of books, magazines, newspapers, movies, streaming music and movie services, audiobook access, computer access, computer training and printing services for adults and children alike. For minimal fees, copy, fax and printing services are also available. "You don't need a library card to walk into the building and spend an entire day here reading books, using the computer, take part in programs. You need a card to check out books, use streaming services, but everything else is available to anyone and everyone," Beryl said.

The library is also home to a robust volunteer program. "I have never worked in a library that had such high level involvement, which is cool because they're our future," Beryl said.

"Lompoc offers a lot of things to get out and have fun, and for free or a nominal charge with the support of local businesses that support connection that comes from our community and does a great job of exposing kids to something different and unique," Osborne said. Just across town at the recreation department, Kizil and her crew does their best to meet the needs of Lompoc's diverse population, too.

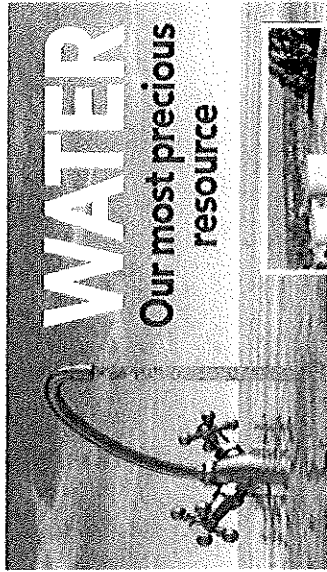

Water management and planning, meter maintenance and upgrades, protecting our ground water and results from our lead in schools study are included in the most recent issue.

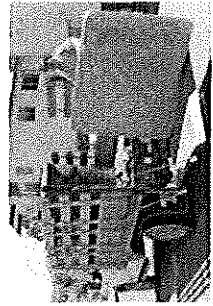

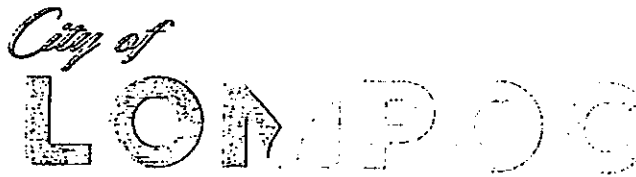
