## Celebrate Fourth of July on the Water



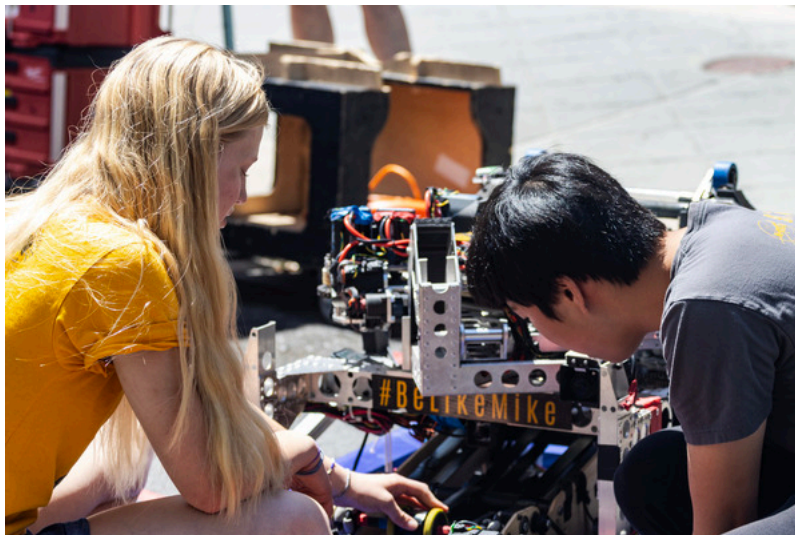
