### **Fairfield releases annual water quality report**

**Fairfield, California (Friday, June 28, 2019)**—The City of Fairfield released its 2018 Consumer Confidence Report, detailing the quality of tap water as it compares to State Water Resources Control Board and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency standards. The report includes details about where Fairfield's water comes from and what it contains.

Fairfield's drinking water is sourced from Lake Berryessa and the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta, and is treated at the Waterman Water Treatment Plant and the North Bay Regional Water Treatment Plant. Based on a series of tests, the quality of Fairfield's drinking water exceeds almost all industry standards.

According to Water Quality Supervisor Jenell Pratt, "A lot goes in to making safe, quality drinking water, and the City's Public Works Department is pleased to report that it continues to supply very high-quality water to its customers."

## Actor, comic Iglesias will drive pace car Sunday

**FAIRFIELD** — Stand-up comedian and actor Gabriel "Pluffy" Iglesias will pilot the Toyota Camry pace car to kick off the Toyota/Save Mart 350 Monster Energy NASCAR Cup Series race on Sunday at Sonoma Raceway.

Iglesias is one of a few to headline and sell-out Madison Square Garden in New York, Staples Center in Los Angeles and Sydney Opera House in Australia.

Celebrating more than 20 years in stand-up comedy, Iglesias is currently on his world tour, "Beyond The Pluffy."

Iglesias is the star and executive producer of the upcoming multiple-camera comedy series for Netflix, "Mr. Iglesias," where he plays a good-natured public high school teacher who works at his alma mater.

He takes on teaching gifted but misfit teens to not only save them from being "counselor out" by a highly bureaucratic assistant principal, but also to help them unlock their full potential.

The series will have 10 half-hour episodes. It premieres Friday.

"A lot of my fans ask me what I would be if I wasn't a stand-up comic," Iglesias said in a press release. "I tell them a history teacher because I love history. So it's great that in this sitcom, I have the

opportunity to live out my alternate reality had I not become Pluffy."

Iglesias will be the first pace car driver to lead the Monster Energy NASCAR Cup Series field through Sonoma Raceway's full, 12-turn, 2.52-mile road course since 1997. The

raceway announced late last year that it would return to its traditional road-course configuration, including the popular Carousel turn, for this year's Toyota/Save Mart 350 as part of its 50th anniversary celebration.

"I can't get over the fact that I will be driving on a race track," Iglesias said in the press release.

## We have bigger homes, but we're unsatisfied

**W**arning: A bigger home won't necessarily make you happier, unless you get a cartoonishly large house. And even then, you might be unhappy after your neighbor does an addition.

You already know that, but science backs it up. I'm a baby boomer. I was raised in a ranch-style from the 1960s, spent most of my adult life in a tract home from the 1970s and now live in a condo from the 1960s (back to the future!).

You could say I'm old and cheap. I prefer the term "old-school."

But information in a recent report lets me know I'm on the right track. The McMansions of the 1980s, 1990s and 2000s held a hidden danger: They had the potential to make the homeowners unhappy.

That finding is from a paper by a guy named Clement Bellet. It also backs up what you've heard from your grandmother, who told you that comparison is a thief of joy.

Grandma was right. Bellet's paper reports that what he calls "house satisfaction" remains steady in America, despite the fact that the median size of newly built homes grew from 1,500 square feet in 1973 to 2,500 square feet in 2015. That's not shocking because another report says that the amount of space per resident has nearly doubled in the past 40 years. Homes are bigger now.

What's mildly surprising is that we aren't any happier with our homes. A four-bedroom, three-bathroom house with a large kitchen and a family room should bring more satisfaction than a

1,000-square-foot three-bedroom, one-bathroom tract house, right?

Not necessarily. Bellet said the reason for the plateauing of satisfaction is simple. It's all about comparison.

He said (and brace yourself, there's some math coming) that if the largest 10 percent of homes in neighborhoods become 10 percent bigger, neighbors become less happy with their homes unless their's also grew 10 percent. In non-math terms, when the biggest house in the neighborhood gets bigger, neighbors become less satisfied unless their house, too, gets bigger.

Bellet points out that the people whose satisfaction is harmed the most are those with the second-largest homes. So if you see yourself as the No. 2-ranked home in your neighborhood, you are miserable if the gap between you and No. 1 grows. People

who own large homes become unhappy when larger homes are built.

The result? Large houses are growing faster than small houses in an arms race to be the biggest, happiest homeowner in the neighborhood, even though it's a race you can't win.

All I know is that this report - and a lifetime of experience - shows that your house doesn't make you happy. And that people who live in glass houses shouldn't throw stones. And that there's no place like (a slightly larger) home.

To recap, here's what we learned: McMansions don't make us happy, unless they're the only one in the neighborhood. When it comes to home size, the old saying is true: Second place is the first loser.

Comparison is a thief of joy.
